

A Quaker Bid to Impeach Nixon

New York

A committee of Quakers, the religious group to which President Nixon formally belongs, has called for his impeachment.

The action disclosed yesterday was described as the first of its kind by a Quaker agency. It was taken by the legislative committee of the New York Yearly Meeting of the Religious Society of Friends.

"Richard Nixon and members of his administration have indulged in acts which render them suspect of betrayal of our democracy," the resolution says.

It asks that the House proceed with his impeachment to fulfill "its obligation to the democratic process as embodied in the Constitution" and to the American people.
