Saxbe Is Nominated By Nixon

Washington

President Nixon submitted the nomination of Senator William B. Saxbe (Rep.-Ohio) to be attorney general to the Senate yesterday after signing into law a measure that will reduce his salary from \$60,000 to \$35,000 a year.

Saxbe was previously barred from being confirmed for the cabinet post by a constitutional prohibition under which members of Congress are not permitted to take a job for which the salary increased while they were lawmakers.

The legislation provides that the compensation for attorney general which was in effect on Jan. 1, 1969, will be effective through noon Jan. 1, 1975.

Mr. Nixon had held up the Saxbe nomination until the constitutional obstacle could be hurdled.

If confirmed, Saxbe will be Mr. Nixon's fourth attorney general.
