

**Trial of White House Aides
In Ellsberg Break-In Delayed**

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 19 (AP) —The trial of John D. Ehrlichman and two other former White House aides in the break-in at the office of Dr. Daniel J. Ellsberg's psychiatrist was postponed Wednesday until April 15. But the defendants said they would ask for dismissal before

then on the grounds that they are subjects of discriminatory prosecution. Lawyers for Mr. Ehrlichman and G. Gordon Liddy told the judge they would contend that White House aides were being prosecuted for a break-in similar to those police officers conduct in the process of an investigation. They contended that the policemen are never prosecuted.
