On Sunday, the press office announced the appointment of Mrs. Nixon as a member and temporary chairman of the group, entifled to compensation of \$138,48 per day.
Yesterday, the press office said that it was illegal for the President to name his wife to any governmental position and that the announcement had been "an administrative error" resulting from failure to make "all legal and other checks."
