

Watergate Panel Lists Witnesses

The Senate select Watergate committee, which resumes its hearings Tuesday morning, released a list of seven witnesses yesterday to be called during three days of testimony next week.

The witnesses are being called to testify about a \$100,000 contribution made by billionaire Howard Hughes to President Nixon's friend, Charles G. (Bebe) Rebozo, in

two \$50,000 installments prior to the 1970 Congressional elections.

The witnesses are Rebozo, former Hughes aide Robert A. Maheu; Richard G. Danner, who runs the Hughes-owned Sands Hotel in Las Vegas; Thomas H. Wakefield, a lawyer and a director of Rebozo's Key Biscayne, Fla. bank; William Griffin, a lawyer for industrialist Robert Abplanalp

who is another close friend of Mr. Nixon; and two Justice Department attorneys, Daddia Rashid and James Coyle.

The committee has gathered conflicting testimony concerning the purpose of the \$100,000 contribution, which Rebozo and President Nixon have said was kept for three years in a safe deposit box before Rebozo returned it to a Hughes emissary in June 1973.
