

3 Appointed To Posts at White House

Washington

Kenneth W. Clawson was named White House director of communications yesterday.

Clawson, 37, a former Washington Post reporter, has been deputy director. He succeeds Herbert Klein, who returned to private business last summer.

In his new job, Clawson, unlike Klein, will report and be responsible to press secretary Ronald Ziegler. The post pays \$40,000 a year.

John J. Chester, a Columbus, Ohio, lawyer, was added to President Nixon's Watergate legal staff as a special counsel to the President with a salary of \$40,000 a year.

Chester, 53, a Republican, brings to 13 the number of full-time lawyers now working on Watergate and related matters for the President.

William J. Baroody Jr., was named to the \$40,000-a-year post of special consultant to the President. He has been a special assistant in the White House and a deputy to departing presidential counsellor Melvin R. Laird for the past year.

The White House said Broody, 36, from Manches-

ter, N.H., will be responsible for providing liaison between the White House and major outside organizations such as farm, labor, veterans, business, civic, academic and professional groups. He also will be working on matters of mutual interest with the vice president, the White House said.
