Impeachment Group Aims Mail Campaign at 6 Million

The National Committee on the Presidency, seeking President Nixon's impeachment, announced yesterday that it would, through a mail campaign, try to reach 6,000,000 voters within the next 45 days.

A first mailing of 500,000 began this week, according to Charles L. Mee Jr., chairman of the committee that was founded in September. Mr. Mee is on leave of absence as editor of Horizon magazine.

The letter campaign, United Press International reported, will be directed to 60 key Congressional districts, which represent the swing votes needed

for a majority of the House of Representatives favoring impeachment, Mr. Mee said.

Others on the committee include Orville H. Schell, President of the Association of the Bay of the City of York City; Barbara Tuchman, historical writer, and Samuel B. Griffith 2d, U.S.M.C., retired.
