# Report of Missing Watergate Papers

New York

Some White House documents that have been described by Watergate witnesses have disappeared from the guarded vault in which they were stored, Time magazine said yesterday.

Time indicated these were the documents referred to by special prosecutor Leon Jaworski last week in a letter to the Senate Judiciary Committee.

Jaworski said that "we have reason to believe that there are additional documents somewhere in the White House files."

Time said it had learned the documents believed to be missing are memos written by former White House aides John D. Ehrlichman, H. R. Haldeman and Charles W. Colson.

The magazine said the

memos referred to activities of the "plumbers," the secret White House investigative unit set up by President Nixon.

The documents originally were stored in a vault in the Executive Office Building, Time said.

"The vault in which the files were kept is guarded by Secret Service agents," Time said, "but they do not search the White House aides and lawyers as they leave the vault after inspecting documents."
