

Ervin Urges New Law To End School Busing

Senator Sam J. Ervin (Dem-N.C.), called yesterday for enactment of a law to end the "horrible tyranny" of school busing to achieve racial balance in the classroom.

Opening three days of hearing by his Senate constitutional rights subcommittee on school busing legislation, Ervin said:

"I can think of no group of people who have stood in greater need of relief from government tyranny than the thousands of innocent, little school children who are being bused to schools many miles away from their neighborhoods in order to satisfy the social theories of federal bureaucrats and to comply with constitutionally

unsound federal court orders."

Ervin said he hopes the subcommittee will approve a legislative proposal "which will effectively put an end to this horrible tyranny."

The subcommittee is considering several proposals to prohibit forced busing, one of which would amend the Constitution to halt further busing for racial purposes.
