DETROIT, March 4 (AP)—
The top woman in the Nixon Administration said today the President would not be impeached and "will regain, inch-by - inch, percentage point-by - percentage point, the confidence of the American people."

Mrs. Anne Armstrong of the Cost of Living Council, said she believed the House of Representatives would find there was no case against the President.

"There've been allegations by the thousands, but there is no evidence," she said at a news conference. "I think there is no grounds for impeachment."

Mrs. Armstrong said she saw no evidence to implicate the President in Watergate or to connect political contributions by the dairy lobby and International Telephone & Telegraph corporation to policies of the Administration.
