Martha Gets Bids For a Book

Book publishers have made offers of up to \$250,000 for the memoirs of Martha Mitchell, her New York literary attorney reported yesterday, but she is holding out for more.

"I've got a lot of what we call action going, and I hope to close a deal for more than that," said the attorney, Paul Gitlin.

He said the memoirs, which are uncompleted, would divulge "the intimate nature of what happened" at private meetings between her husband, former attorney general John N. Mitchell, and other figures in the Watergate affair.
