To Panel Starts

The White House delivered the first batch of Watergate tapes and documents to the House Judiciary Committee Friday evening for its impeachment inquiry on President Nixon, it was disclosed yesterday.

John M. Doar, the committee's chief impeachment counsel, said that some of the documents were from "federal departments."

Doar did not elaborate, but syndicated columnist Jack Anderson reported in a radio broadcast that the cartons delivered to the Capitol late Friday included documents from the Agriculture Department and the Environmental Protection Agency, presumably dealing with 1972 campaign contributions from the milk industry and corporations accused of violating antipollution laws.
