Sen. Gurney Reports on Spending

Tallahassee, Fla.

Senator Edward Gurney yesterday filed copies of a federal re-election campaign report listing \$80,245 in contributions and \$75,611 in expenditures.

The report was filed with the state by Friends of Ed Gurney of Washington.

The organization reported that its national fund-raising efforts in January and February netted \$32,395 in contributions for the Florida Republican, a member of the Senate Watergate Committee.

A federal grand jury in Jacksonville, Fla., is reportedly looking into allegations that at least \$375,000 was collected in Gurney's name in 1972 from builders hoping for his influence with the

Federal Housing Administration.

The Friends of Ed Gurney organization listed the largest contributions, which included:

\$1000 each from David Packard, Palo Alto, Calif., board chairman of Hewlett-

Packard co.; Al Hill, Dallas oil producer; and Billy Rogers, a South Bay, Fla., grower.

- \$250 from W. Clement Stone, Chicago insurance millionaire who was President Nixon's largest 1972 contributor.
