

Ruckelshaus' Wife Urges Nixon to Stay

NAIROBI, Kenya, March 25 (AP)—Jill Ruckelshaus, who resigned last week as White House women's affairs adviser, said today President Nixon should stay in office and face possible impeachment.

Mrs. Ruckelshaus said Mr. Nixon would be yielding to 'unfair pressures' if he resigned over Watergate.

Mr. and Mrs. Ruckelshaus were guests in Kenya of Maurice Strong, executive director of the Nairobi-based United Nations environment program. Ruckelshaus, head of the German-Marshall Plan Fund, a West German-financed foundation with environmental interests, is discussing possible joint programs with the U.N. agency.
