Nixon Thanks Coast Women For Rallying His Supporters

WASHINGTON, March 27

(AP)—Two California women who described themselves as "rank amateurs" in politics got the personal thanks of President Nixon yesterday for starting a campaign to marshal more than 30,000 supporters of the President.

Mrs. Bernice Pentell of Berkeley and Mrs. Beverley Acker of Concord, Calif., told reporters at the White House that they felt there was no effective voice expressing the views of supporters of the President. They set out on their own to reach persons who felt as they did.

They presented to the President a list of some 30,000 names they had personally collected and said that others who had joined in their campaign raised the total to about 70,000 names.
