The best interests of this country would not be served by resignation of the President. They would be served by the House Judiciary Committee completing its investigations as speedily as possible and reporting the findings to the whole House.

If impeachment is voted, the best interests of the country would be served by the President notifying the President pro tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives of his temporary inability to serve during the impending trial by the Senate in accordance with Article

XXV of the Constitution. The Vice President would then serve as Acting President. The government of the country could continue, unstullified by a national crisis.

Regardless of the outcome of the trial by the Senate, removal or retention of the President, this would demonstrate to all the world that, even in such a time, our government, based on the principles of law and order at the highest levels will long endure.
