Arthur Liman, an attorney, testified for the defense at the Mitchell-Stans trial on Monday that he had told G. Bradford Cook, then counsel to the Securities and Exchange Commission, that disclosure of a secret \$200,000 cash contribution made by Robert L. Vesco to President Nixon's re-election campaign would not embarrass Mr. Vesco but "that it might prove embarrassing to other people." The New York Times reported erroneously that Mr. Liman had made this statement to Stanley Sporkin, an S.E.C. investigator.
