## A Delay for Nixon on '73 Tax Returns

The Internal Revenue Service has given President Nixon a "normal" 60-day extension in filing his 1973 income tax returns because of his back tax bill of almost half a million dollars, the White House said yestedray.

Geraid L. Warren, Mr. Nixon's deputy press secre-tary, said the President was granted the "normal extension in filing time because of the nearness of the Internal Revenue Service ruling" that he owes \$467,000 in back taxes and interest for returns between 1969 and 1972.

Like all other American taxpayers, Mr. Nixon faced a deadline of midnight to-night for filing his 1973 income tax returns. Warren said Mr. Nixon's tax lawyers, Kenneth Gemmill and H. Chapman Rose, had requested the extension.
