## Warm Crowd Greets Nixon at Church

Key Biscayne, Fla.

President Nixon went to Easter Sunday church services and received "Happy Easter" shouts and applause from a small, friendly crowd outside the church.

The President and members of his family shook hands with well-wishers after the 11 a.m. service at the Key Biscayne Community Church.

Here for a long holiday weekend in the sun, the President spent a quiet Easter with his family at the

bayside compound.

Mr. Nixon and his wife, Pat, went to the Congregationalist church with daughter and son-in-law Tricia and Edward Cox, and their friend C. G. (Bebe) Rebozo. They sat in a second-row pew in a congregation of about 250.

When the President left the church, a small group of youngsters shouted "Happy Easter" to him and Mr. Nixon went over to greet them.

As the Nixon family shook hands in the crowd, 10-year-

old Martha Hutcheson pressed a purple Easter egg decorated with "Happy Easter" into the President's hand.

Mrs. Nixon's Easter outfit was a green-and-white print linen suit.

Tricia was dressed in white. She wore a ruffle-trimmed, short-sleeved white jacket dress and a broad-brimmed white hat trimmed with tiny pink blossoms.
