President Nixon's job rating remains unchanged in the latest Gallup survey.

The figures, recorded before the findings of the investigation into Mr. Nixon's tax records were released, show 26 per cent of the public approve of the way he is handling his job as President. About two-thirds, 65 per cent, disapprove, and nine per cent have no opinion.

The President's rating has fluctuated very little during 1974, reaching a high of 28 per cent and a low of 25 per cent approval during the year.

Here is the question asked about each President since the administration of Franklin D. Roosevelt:

"Do you approve or disapprove of the way (name of incumbent) is handling his job as President?"
