60-Day Extension Is Given
Nixon on 1973 Tax Return

KEY BISCAYNE, Fla., April 14 (UPI)—The Internal Revenue Service has given President Nixon a "normal" 60-day extension in filing his 1973 income tax return because of his back-tax bill of almost half-a-million dollars, the White House said Sunday.

Gerald L. Warren, Mr. Nixon's deputy press secretary, said the President had been granted the "normal extension in filing time because of the nearness of the Internal Revenue Service ruling" on April 3 that he owes \$432,787.13 in back taxes for returns between 1969 and 1972.

As do most other American taxpayers, Mr. Nixon faced a midnight deadline tomorrow for filing his 1973 income tax returns. Mr. Warren said Mr. Nixon's tax lawyers, Kenneth Gemmill and H. Chapman Rose, had requested the extension.
