The judge delayed sentencing Mr. Melcher on the misdemeanor charge, which carries a maximum sentence of a year in jail and a \$5,000 fine. He is the 10th person to plead guilty in connection with illegal corporate contributions, and three tothers have been charged.

In his guilty plea, Mr. Melcher said that Mr. Steinbrenner was indicted by a Federal grand jury in Cleveland two weeks ago on 14 counts including alleged at tempts to obstruct investigations by falsifying records and ordering company officers to make false statements.
