Porter Starts 30-Day Term For Lying About Watergate

LOMPOC, Calif., April 22 (UPI)—Herbert L. Porter, who was the scheduling director for President Nixon's re-election campaign, entered the Federal Correctional Institution here Monday to serve a 30-day sentence for lying in the Watergate investigation.

Mr. Porter was taken to the minimum security camp at the prison. He is to serve the full 30 days here and then go on probation for one year, according to the terms of his sentence.

Mr. Porter, whose home is in Laguna Niguel, Calif., testified in the Senate Watergate hearings last June that he had lied to the Federal Bureau of Investigation about money he gave to G. Gordon Liddy, who was later convicted as a leader of the break-in at the Democratic party headquarters on June 17, 1972.
