Segretti's Plea
To High Court
On Disbarment

Convicted political saboteur Donald Segretti asked the State Supreme Court yesterday to put a temporary stop to disbarment proceedings against him.

Segretti was released last month from the federal minimum-security prison at Lompoc after serving four and a half months of a six months sentence for distributing phony campaign literature during the 1972 Presidential campaign.

In a petition filed yesterday, he also asked the Supreme Court to order the State Bar to explain why they should not be restricted from using Segretti's Senate Watergate testimony against him.

Segretti claimed that he was granted immunity from further legal action when he testified before the Ervin committee on Oct. 3, 1973, two weeks after he was convicted of political dirty tricks.
