Stans Withholds Donor List

President Nixon's 1972 campaign fund-raising committee has refused to obey a grand jury subpoena for lists kept by its chairman, Maurice Stans, of persons who contributed to the Nixon campaign and were then recommended for federal jobs through the White House.

The subpoena also seeks a second Stans list of persons who refused solicitations to contribute to the Nixon campaign and then were apparently blacklisted from federal posts.

The lists, according to the subpoena, are among three filing cabinets of Nixon campaign - related documents that the special Watergate prosecutor's office has con-tended are needed for an

tended are needed for an ongoing federal grand jury investigation of possible violations of bribery and conspiracy laws.

Associate special prosecutor Thomas F. McBride stated in a petition filed in U.S. District Court here yesterday that the grand jury also is investigating possible violations of a federal law that prohibits promising government jobs or See LISTS, A26, Col. 1
