Paying Martha Mitchell's Bills

It probably won't surprise anyone, but Martha Mitchell's phone bills sometimes ran into five-figures.

That disclosure comes from someone close to former Attorney General John Mitchell, who says Mitchell has continued to pay her living expenses as they occurred during their separation.

The subject of Mrs. Mitchell's finances is one that is going to be widely reported in coming weeks.

Sources close to her claim that she is "flat broke" and would have been left stranded in Phoenix recently if someone hadn't come to her rescue.
