**FEDERAL JOB LINKED  
TO DATA ON POLITICS**

HOUSTON, May 14 (UPI) — Charles G. Rebozo, former Attorney General John N. Mitchell and Senator John G. Tower Republican of Texas all aided in obtaining a Government job for a political supporter in exchange for information on a Chicano political party in Texas. The Houston Post said in a copy right article today.

The newspaper said that documents in the Watergate investigation indicated the three strong supporters of President Nixon's re-election in 1972 influenced the hiring of Celso Moreno, then of Corpus Christi, to a position with the Cabinet Committee on Opportunities for Spanish-speaking People.

Campaign documents held by the Senate Watergate committee, the Post said, show that Mr. Moreno gathered political information on the party, La Raza Unida, while being paid \$400 a week as a government consultant.

The documents show Nixon campaign officials were trying to persuade La Raza Unida to remain neutral in the 1972 Presidential election, The Post said.

Federal law prohibits Government employes from engaging in partisan politics.

According to The Post, Mr. Rebozo, a close friend of the President, was a political acquaintance of Mr. Moreno. At the time of the incident, Mr. Mitchell headed Mr. Nixon's re-election campaign.
