Ford, Disputing Graham, Denies U.S. Has Lost 'Moral Compass'

—Vice President Ford, disagreeing with the Rev. Billy Graham, said today that he did not believe America had lost its "moral compass."

While reiterating his earlier views that the transcripts of White House conversations on Watergate "do not confer saint hood on anybody," he said that he had faith "in the basic morality of the American people."

Mr. Ford's comments came at a news conference here this morning before he joined Mr. Graham, the evangelist, in a foursome in the Kemper Open Invitation Golf Tournament.

In a statement issued yesterday, Mr. Graham expressed his concern over what he saw as the nation's loss of its "moral compass"—a phrase that Jeb Stuart Macgruder used last week in reference to himself after his sentencing for his role in the Watergate cover-up.

In his statement, Mr. Graham said that he could not "but deplore the moral tone implied" in President Nixon's conversations with White House aides about the Watergate affair.
