President Nixon, in a discussion of news leaks, remarked to JOhn W. Dean III on Feb. 28, 1973:

"Some of our Jewish friends in the media have an in around here. Kissinger leaks, Simon leaks and Stein leaks." The quotation, taped but deleted from a transcript made public by the President, was leaked to The Los Angeles Times yesterday in the midst of a rumor-filled controversy over whether Mr. Nixon made derogatory ethnic remarks in that conversation as well as one in March 20, 1973.

After the New York Times reported that Mr. Nixon had made "disparaging remarks about Jews and called Judge John J. Sirica a 'Wop,' "White House counsel J. Fred Buzhardt denied there were any deleted slurs on the tapes.

Buzhardt reiterated his position Sunday affer Representative Jerome R. Waldie (Dem-Antioch), a member of the House Judiciary Committee studying impeachment, said on CBS' "Face the Nation" that there were "defamatory ethnic references" deleted from the Febuary 28 transcript.

AlthoughWaldie refused to

cite the alleged "defamatory" remarks, he accused Buzhardt and "perhaps the President" of "gross insensitivity."

However, another strong critic of the President on the committee — who asked not to be identified — said he did not find the remark offensive.

One of the three sources of news leaks cited by the President as Jewish is not. Secretary of the Treasury William E. Simon is a Roman Catholic.

Also, Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger, though born to Jewish parents, does not practice the Jewish religion and does not belong to a Jewish organization.

Herbert E. Stein, the third administration official is chairman of the Council of Economic Advisers and Jewish.
