## Jaworski Tied to Decisio For Closed Impeach Probe

The House Judiciary Committee's decision last week to put off public, televised hearings of the impeachment investigation was influenced by Watergate speski, according to committee members and officials.

The sources said that Jaworski told John M. Doar, the committee's special impeachment counsel, that immediate public hearings would create problems for his investigation.

The committee is temporarily turning its attention away from the Watergate case and will begin closed hearings today on whether impeachable offenses arose from pledges of large 1972 campaign contributions by the International Telephone and Telegraph Corp. and dairy cooperatives.
