President Nixon last year told his White House Chief of Staff H.R. Haldeman that money from a secret fund woull be made available for Haldeman's legal defense in the Watergate case, according to accounts of secret testimony given to the Senate Watergate committee.

The President told Haldeman that the money was kept by Charles G. (Bebe) Rebozo, the sources said. and included as much as \$400,000.
