## Curb on Presidential Staffs Approved by a House Panel

WASHINGTON, June 7 (AP) —Legislation aimed at curbing and realigning Presidential staffs and abolishing the President's discretionary \$1-million emergency fund has cleared at House committee.

The House Post Office and Civil Service Committee, in apart proving the measure yesterday, also set manpower and salary levels for Vice-Presidential staffs and required that Congress be informed of the names.

gress be informed of the names and duties of personnel borrowed for the White House staff from other executive agencies.

Representative Morris K. Udall, Democrat of Arizona, who pushed the restrictive features, said that Presidential staffs had grown large and exerted enormous power while remaining largely anonymous.
