

William Buckley Feels Nixon Will Be Ousted

Conservative political commentator William F. Buckley said yesterday he believes there are enough votes in the House to impeach President Nixon and enough votes in the Senate to convict him.

Asked by a reporter if he feels a majority of the House will vote for an impeachment bill and if the Senate will then convict the President, Buckley said, "Yes, I do — to both questions." A two-thirds vote in the Senate is required for conviction.

The writer and television personality also said at a news conference that if Vice President Gerald Ford succeeds Mr. Nixon because of impeachment or resignation, Ford will easily be renominated for the presidency by Republicans in 1976.
