Pickets at The Post

Supporters of President Nixon lobbied yesterday on Capitol Hill and picketed The Washington Post building.

About 15 persons visited the office of House Judiciary Committee Chairman Peter W. Rodino (D.-N.J.) and demanded that the Committee treat Mr. Nixon fairly in its impeachment deliberations according to a spokesman for Rodino.

None of the Nixon supporters was able to see Rodino or other members of Congress. In conversations with congressional staff members the demonstrators said the Judiciary Committee has enough evi-

dence and should vote on impeachment now.

About 100 persons picketed the offices of The Post. Shouting, singing and wearing buttons proclaiming "Support The President," members of the crowd demanded fairness by the press in covering President Nixon.

According to one of the leaders of the marchers, Rabbi Dennis Liff of New York, "The Washington Post is staffed by reporters biased against those who do not believe in the liberal philosophy."

The protesters, who are in Washington attending a conference being sponsored by the National Citizens Committee for Fairness to the President, arrived at the Post building at 11 a.m. after having seen Mr. Nixon off on his trip to the Mideast and attending a prayer breakfast.

Baruch Korff, the Massachusetts rabbi who founded the NCCFP last year, appeared briefly at the demonstration, which lasted slightly more than an hour.

Judith C. Hanlen, like the other supporters of Mr. Nixon, said she paid her way to Washington. Mrs. Hanlen said she came because "I felt so helpless back home; I just had to come to Washington to find out what I can do to preserve the presidency."
