Probe of Kissinger To Continue

The Senate Foreign Relations Committee met in closed session yesterday and decided to proceed with its investigation of Secretary of State Henry Kissinger's role in the wiretapping of 13 government officials and four newsmen between 1969 and 1971.

A staff aide said that chairman J. William Fulbright (Dem-Ark.) sent a letter to the Justice Department asking for additional FBI documents relating to the wiretaps.

No date has been set for any hearings into whether Kissinger was candid with the committee when it approved his nomination as secretary of state last fall.

Kissinger has said that he would resign if not cleared of allegations that he had not been completely honest
