Two Germanys Are Exchanging Envoys

Arriving in East Berlin yesterday to take up residence as West Germany's first permanent representative there, West German State Secretary **Günter Gaus** said his accreditation marked a new beginning in relations between the two Germanys. The exchange of plenipotentiaries had been arranged as long ago as December, 1972, in the good-neighbor treaty between East and West Germany, but continuing frictions delayed matters.

Mr. Gaus will present his credentials tomorrow, as the same time that his East German counterpart, **Dr. Michael Kohl**, will be formally accredited in Bonn by President **Gustav Heinemann**.

Queen Margrethe of Denmark and her husband, **Prince Henrik**, yesterday began a four-day State visit to West Germany, the first visit to Germany by a Danish monarch in 61 years. They were met at the railway station in Brühl by President **Gustav Heinemann** and his wife **Hilda**.

Mrs. Martha Mitchell's stint this week as co-hostess of the WCBS-TV "Pat Collins Show" is turning into a mini-memoir. In yesterday's installment, the estranged wife of **John N. Mitchell**, the former Attorney General, suggested that her troubles with President Nixon dated back to the night he walked into his room at Camp David and found her on his bed. "At Camp David it was the custom to show movies," said Mrs. Mitchell. "This night they had a movie I couldn't stand and I removed myself very quietly. I walked into his bedroom, threw myself on the bed and looked for something to read. In that entire room all I could find was TV Guide. Then he came in. That was the beginning of a lot of bad things for Martha."

gitimate children has won a share of his \$100-million-plus estate. A recently passed French law, a court in Aix-en-Provence ruled, gives an automatic share of the estate to **Mrs. Maier Widmaier**, the 39-year-old daughter born of Picasso's liaison with **Marie-Thérèse Walter**.

Two Picasso children born to another mistress, **Françoise Gilot**, had previously won court recognition as heirs. Each of the three will be entitled to only half as much of the estate as Picasso's only legitimate heir, **Paulo Picasso**. The artist's widow, **Jacqueline**, gets half the inheritance and the children share the remainder.

"I am very disgusted with

the Watergate mess; it was a ridiculous move that gained very little and it deepened my disillusion with American politics," said **Angela (Bay) Buchanan**, whose brother works in the White House, in explaining why she plans to emigrate to Australia.

Patrick J. Buchanan, special assistant to the President, confirmed yesterday that his 25-year-old sister, who is vacationing, is leaving Washington and the country. Miss Buchanan was quoted in an Australian newspaper as saying, "There are very few American political figures I have any trust in," but she said that didn't include President Nixon. "She is very high on the President," her

brother said yesterday, "but I don't know about me."

Midway through a lecture at Philadelphia's Playhouse in the Park, **Dr. David Reuben**, author of "Everything You Always Wanted to Know About Sex," was interrupted by 10 gay activists, who hopped onstage and accused him of being "a criminal" because of his largely negative views on homosexuality. The police intervened, a fight broke out, and one protester and a police officer were injured.

When things had quieted down, Dr. Reuben resumed his lecture, noting that "after this, the City of Brotherly Love takes on a new meaning to me."
