President Nixon will leave Washington early today for his second foreign trip of the month and his third summit meeting with Soviet Communist party leader Leonid Brezhney.

The President, who returned to Washington last Wednesday after a tour fo five Middle East countries, will take off from Andrews Air Force Base at 8:30 a.m. on a flight to Brussels, where he will meet tomorrow with NATO government chiefs and sign the new Atlantic declaration agreed to last week by NATO foreign ministers in Ottawa.

The President will fly from Brussels to Mescow Thursday morning,

While in the Soviet Union, Mr. Nixon will also visit

Brezhnev at his vacation home on the Black Sea and stop for part of a day in Minsk on th way back to Moscow.

This Saturday, the President is scheduled to drive to Star City outside Moscow to tour the Soviet space headquarters and meet the American astronauts and Soviet cosmonauts training for the Apollo-Soyuz joint docking mission scheduled for next year.

According to present plans, Mr. Nixon will return to Washington Wednesday, July 3, and speak to the nation by television the same evening. In the speech, he plans to report on his recent Middle East trip as well as on his visits to Belgium and the Soviet Union.
