Colson Is Disbarred By Court in Capital

WASHINGTON, June 25 (AP) — Charles W. Colson, the former White House aide who pleaded guilty to obstructing justice in disseminating derogatory material about Daniel Ellsberg, was disbarred Tuesday by the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.

The order, signed by three judges of the court, prohibits Mr. Colson "from holding himself out to be an attorney at law" licensed to practice before the local District Court.
