Admiral Elmo Zumwalt perations, rediring chief of naval operations, said resterday he had refused appointment as head of the beseiged Veterans Administration because "it was not possible to do that job in the way it ought to be done."

Zumwalt, who leaved his Pentagon post today for private life, said the VA job offer was extended by White House chief of staff Alexander M. Halg Jr. at President Nixon's behest.

Admisistrator Donal Johnson, target of much congressional criticism, has announced his resignation but remains in the effice panding appointment of a successor.

"I feel that veterans of the Southeast Atia war have not been well served," Zumwalt said. "Much improvement in benefits would be required and I did not see a way of getting that changed."

Pressed on that comments.
Zumwalt added only, "In think the domestic political condition is such that important, innovative new pressurements have very little chance for success."
