Nixon Gains L. I. Support,
Newspaper Poll Indicates

GARDEN CITY, L. I., June 30 (UPI) — President Nixon has gained substantial support TAO
GARDEN CITY, L. I., June 30—President Nixon has gained substantial support among Long Islanders since April, Newsday said today in a report on a poll taken less than a week ago. "Interviews conducted last week, following the President's highly publicized Mideast trip, show that there has been a significant erosion — roughly 12 per cent — in public attitudes favoring Nixon's resignation or impeachment," the newspaper said.
The new poll shows 39 per

cent in favor of impeachment, 52 per cent opposed, 8 per cent undecided and 1 per cent refused to answer. The results of the previous poll, taken April 22, indicated that 47 per cent of Long Islanders thought Mr. Nixon should be impeached, 40 per cent did not, 6 per cent were undecided and 1 per cent refused to answer.
"The latest poll, conducted by telephone Monday and Wednesday among 741 Long Islanders picked at random from the telephone directories," Newsday said, found less support for the resignation of the President than at any time in the last seven months: 40 per cent in favor, 50 per cent opposed, 9 per cent undecided and 1 per cent refused to answer.
