

Haig Talks

San Clemente

President Nixon believes he will survive in office because "an impeachable case has not been made against him" by House investigators, his chief of staff said yesterday.

General Alexander M. Haig added that the President's summit trips to the Middle East and Moscow "reinforced his own determination to focus on governing the United States."

In an interview, Haig told reporters Mr. Nixon feels that in "the thousands of hours of testimony . . . there has been no impeachable offense confirmed by the evidence" presented to the House Judiciary Committee considering impeachment.

Haig said Mr. Nixon came back from his travels abroad "spiritually and intellectually stimulated . . . and very conscious of the need to continue."
