Gallup Says Only 23% Cite Republican Affiliation

The percentage of Americans identifying themselves as Republicans has fallen to 23, the Gallup poll reported yesterday. This is the lowest level since the Gallup organization began asking the party-affiliation question in 1940.

Paralleling the drop in Republican adherence, the poll found, was a rise in those who call themselves political independents.

The new totals showed 44

The new totals showed 44 per cent classifying themselves as Democrats, 33 per cent as independents and 23 per cent as Republicans. Two years ago the totals were 43 per cent Democrats, 28 per cent Republicans and 29 per cent independents.

The Gallup organization said that both sets of figures excluded the small number—2 to 3 per cent who said they were not in any of the three categories.

The most recent finding is based on the following question put to 12,430 adults, 18 years of age or older, in eight surveys conducted between March and June of this year:

"In politics, as of today, do you consider yourself a Republican, Democrat or independent?"

Those calling themselves Republicans have been fewer than self-styled Democrats for more than three decades, the Gallup organization said.
