'W' Identified

As Haldeman

In a draft memorandum written by White House aide Richard Moore included in the House Judiciary Committee's evidence on White House surveillance and campaign activities, one individual is repeatedly referred to only as "W."

"W" is reported in the memo to have been the person who approved the hiring of Donald H. Segretti as the 1972 Nixon campaign chief of dirty tricks.

Moore, asked yesterday who "W" was, identified him as former White House chief of staff H. R. (Bob) Haldeman, the man who in more than four years built a reputation for insulating President

Nixon from outsiders and cold-shouldering even Cabinet members.

"W" stood for Haldeman's Signal Corps code name, Moore said, which was: "Welcome."
