Panel Says 17 Phone Taps Found No Security Leaks

WASHINGTON, July 18—None of the telephone taps placed by the Nixon Administration on 13 Govenment officials and four newsmen ever disclosed any leaks of classified information to the press, according to evidence made public today by the House Judiciary Committee.

The committee released an extensive collection of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and other documents relating to the 21-month-long wiretap program that it had correlated.
