

Nixon's Face Treated for A Blemish

SAN CLEMENTE, July 20 (UPI)—A dark blotch on President Nixon's right temple is a skin blemish that has been treated with liquid air, the President's personal physician, Dr. Walter Tkach, said Friday.

"A dermatologist examined it and said it is all right," Tkach said, but there is still some possibility it may have to be removed later. Tkach replied to questions from a reporter who noticed that the spot, near Mr. Nixon's right eye, appeared darker than in the past.

The physician identified the blemish as a non-malignant senile cartosis.

Tkach said Mr. Nixon's left ankle is still somewhat swollen from the phlebitis that pained him during his Middle East tour, but the blood clot has stabilized and the President is in no danger from it.

Following his doctor's orders, Mr. Nixon has been getting plenty of exercise during his working vacation at the Western White House, swimming and walking on the beach frequently.
