

# 69% Backed Tape Turnover Ruling

In a survey taken before the U.S. Supreme Court handed down its decision, a majority of the American people, by 69 to 22 per cent, thought the President "should hand over the tapes

if ordered" by the high court to the Watergate special prosecutor.

If he decided to ignore such a court order, a majority of the public, 57 to 33 per cent, believed that Congress should "impeach and

remove President Nixon from office."

In another matter which went before the Supreme Court at the same time, a 55-to-25 per cent majority of the public feels that "the Watergate grand jury was right to have named Presi-

dent Nixon as an unindicted co-conspirator in the cover-up." The grand jury said that it would have indicted Mr. Nixon if it had not been informed that a sitting President could not be named in an indictment for obstruction of justice.
