

SENTENCING OF DEAN SLATED FOR FRIDAY

WASHINGTON, July 30(AP)
—John W. Dean 3d, the former White House counsel, who has pleaded guilty to a Watergate criminal charge, will be sentenced on Friday, United States District Court officials said today.

Since pleading guilty on a conspiracy count last Oct. 19, he has been serving as a major source of evidence for the Watergate cover-up case to a single count of conspiracy to obstruct justice and defraud the United States. He could receive a maximum of five years in prison and a fine of \$10,000 from Judge John J. Sirica.

In another courtroom, a former Presidential assistant, John D. Ehrlichman, and three other defendants in the "plumbers" case are to be sentenced tomorrow. They were convicted of plotting the break-in in 1971 at the office of Dr. Daniel Ellsberg's former psychiatrist.
