

A crowd formed outside the White House to cheer and jeer the resigned President

For one last time, there was a "support the President" rally in front of the White House last night.

In the same spot where anti-Nixon and anti-Vietnam war demonstrators had marched, rallied, fasted and held long vigils, a band of the President's most ardent supporters sang the "Battle Hymn of the Republic," prayed and waved pennants reading, "God Loves Nixon."

Hundreds of tourists, some of them speaking German, French and Spanish, mingled among the demonstrators and gazed through the iron bars of the fence at the White House.

There were discordant notes. Persons opposed to Mr. Nixon's remaining in the White House waved "Impeach Nixon" and "Jail to the Chief" bumper stickers.
