

Watergate Guard Says No Position Is Too High

WASHINGTON, Aug. 8 (UPI)—Frank Wills, the security guard who discovered the Watergate break-in, said today that no one was exempt from being honest and forthright.

Mr. Wills on the night of June 17, 1972, discovered a door at the Watergate complex with the lock taped. He called the police, who arrested five men in the Democratic National Committee offices.

He said: "No position is too high—if you are wrong, you are wrong, especially if you are elected by a majority of the United States citizens and especially when they elect you to be sincere, honest and forthright."
