
Nixon-Brezhnev Pictures Replaced in Moscow

MOSCOW, Aug. 9 (AP)—Photographs of a smiling Richard M. Nixon with Soviet Communist party leader, Leonid I. Brezhnev, taken during their recent Moscow summit meeting, disappeared today from a window display along Kalinin Prospekt, one of Moscow's main streets.

The pictures were put up shortly after the summit, which took place from June 27 to July 3. Throngs of people stopped to look at them daily.

The photos, titled "Visit of the U.S. President," were still up yesterday morning, but later in the day they were replaced by pictures of husky farm-equipment drivers and other strictly Soviet subjects.
